




## Face up

Concealer in shade 40w, £11.95, Lush Foundation in shade 19w, £11.95, Lush Concealer in shade 1c, £11.95, Lush Available in 40 shades, Lush's Slap Stick foundation is solid, egg-shaped and dipped in wax, rather than being covered in plastic. Lush also offers lipsticks either in recycled plastic or packaging-free (you just peel off some wax and can then pop it into an old container), Glow Sticks, which can be used all over the face, and concealers that work in the same way as the foundations, with a little bit of wax on the tip.

My make-up bag is also filled with gorgeous Inika Organic products (its eyeshadows are amazing), which are 100% vegan, including all its brushes. Jane Iredale is another ace mineral-based vegan make-up range.





18-in-1 Peppermint Pure-Castile Soap, £7.69, Dr Bronner's
A classic. I use this soap to wash my newly inked tattoos as it's made from natural ingredients, which come from organic and fair-trade farms. The packaging is also made from 100% post-consumer recycled bottles.

Skin Balm, £35, Isla Apothecary
Another wonderful small-batch
company, Isla Apothecary designs,
infuses, formulates, hand-blends,
hand-pours, labels by hand and
ships from its London base.

Foaming Hand Wash, £4, BeCo This foaming hand wash saves 88 litres of water per bottle, compared to other liquid hand washes, and lasts two-and-a-half times longer. Plus, did you notice the logo has braille underneath it?

Celestial Patchouli Eau de Parfum, £95 for 50ml, Sana Jardin This is my new signature scent. It really makes me feel good when I wear it - and I love knowing that it's also doing good.

Cold Pressed Cacay Face Oil, £15, Cut.Le.Crap.
This brand is all about cutting the crap, from what's in its products to how it sends them out. Cut.Le.Crap never use chemicals. And use glass, aluminium and plant-based plastic for its bottles, which are recyclable down to the biodegradable labels. Even its packing foam fillers are compostable. •
